process.

- Call to be added to the OASAS waitlist.
- 2. The program coordinator will call to determine eligibility and conduct an over-the-phone needs assessment. They will then schedule an in-home assessment.
- 3. A licensed occupational therapist will conduct an in-home needs assessment.
- 4. The occupational therapist will work with construction manager to develop a work scope that is unique to you and your home.
- The work scope will be discussed with you and work will be scheduled.
- 6. Modifications will be made, at no cost to you.
- 7. You will be enrolled in A Matter of Balance, an evidence-based fall prevention program.
