Emergency Services

Wayne CAP Success Center provides an emergency food pantry, goal-oriented assistance, and offers clothing, furniture, and household items to those in need.

As true agents of community change, Wayne CAP Success Center is focused on promoting self-sufficiency and long-term sustainable lifestyles. Patrons accessing the numerous services are thus required to fill out an intake sheet. Including but not limited to: proof of income and address for all individuals living in the household. This data allows the dedicated staff to make appropriate referrals to partnering agencies, ensuring the highest level of assistance is provided to each client and helps provide information to grants to receive funding that will keep the Success Center operational.



Clothing, Supplies & Furniture Closet

Wayne CAP Success Center accepts donations of gently used clothing, household supplies and furniture throughout the year.

If you are in need of a particular item, please call us for assistance. If we do not have your item available at the time, we will place you on a waiting list to be contacted if the item is received.

Job and Housing Search Assistance

The Success Center offers assistance in locating employment and/or housing to our community residents.

Case Management

Every patron that receives our services is also encouraged to participate in case management referral services. Clients will be referred to an advocate within our agency who can assist in determining what services are needed and make the proper referrals.

Nutrition Education

The Success Center partners with Cornell Cooperative Extension and Foodlink to provide nutrition education classes.

Second Chances

Start the Change

Second Chances offers temporary housing and support services to homeless individuals.

Qualifications

Residents must be 18 or older and meet eligibility requirements as defined by US Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

If you or someone you are working with meets these requirements, please contact our dedicated staff so we may assist.

Length of Stay

Residents may stay at the Success Center House a maximum of six (6) months.

During their stay, residents will be SUPPORTED to identify and ACHIEVE goals they set as steps to become SELF SUFFICIENT.

Living Accommodations

Each resident receives the following:

Twin bed	Desk lamp
Bedding	Alarm clock
Towels	Closet space
Pillows	Dresser

*Initial toiletry items also available

** Each spacious bedroom houses two individuals

Everyday Comforts

The bright and open dining area accommodates small group seating. Breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks are provided.

Coffee, juice, milk, and fruit are available all day.

The common living room contains comfortable seating and a shared TV with basic cable. A telephone is also available for resident use.

Open back covered deck offers a beautiful view of the house garden and a roomy social area for residents.

Resident generated activities are encouraged and supported throughout the stay at the Success Center House.

Connecting with Resources

Case management services are provided to ALL residents. It is our hope that each resident leaves equipped with the life skills and knowledge to become SELF SUFFICIENT.

Referrals to appropriate additional services are made as needed.

Make getting connected easy!

The RTS bus stops 5 TIMES daily. Bus passes are available on site for purchase or sign-out, as appropriate.

Other Success Center Services Offered

Emergency Shelter Beds

Emergency shelter beds are leases used up to 30-days for homeless individuals. Eligibility is determined by Department of Social Services

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Apartments for Success

Apartments for Success is temporary living up to 24 months. These are efficiency apartments for homeless individuals with on-site case management, mental health counseling, peer support services, nutritional guidance, and connection to additional services that are not available on-site. These services are provided to assist with the end goal of obtaining and sustaining permanent independent living.
